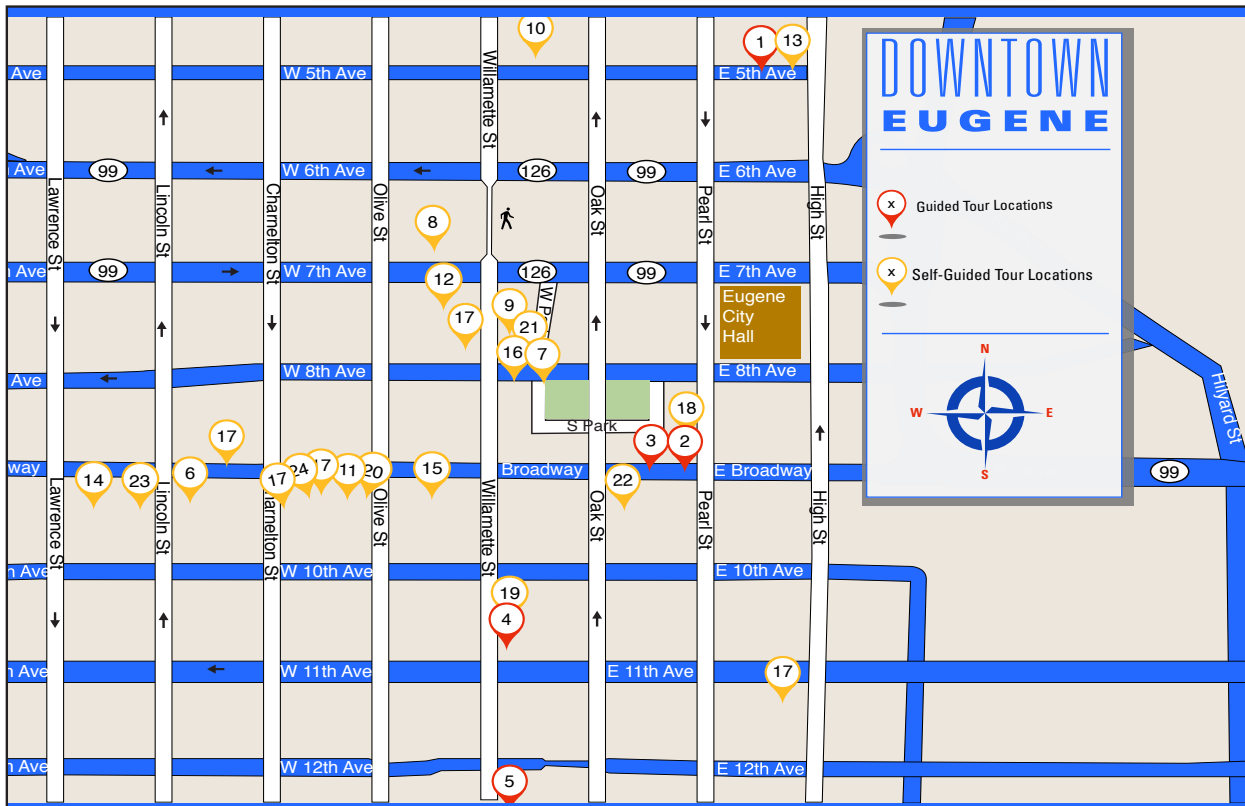

1) 5:30 PM STUDIO TRE AMICHE (295 E 5th Ave)

Studio Tre Amiche has moved! They are now at 295 W 5th Ave., directly across from 5th Street Market. Works by Patsy Hand, Kathryn Hutchinson, and Rogena Degge are on display. Patsy shows a series of interpretive mixed media works reflecting her interest in the dynamics of shadows and shape, and the energy from the mix of people and machines. Rogena explores fluid and geometric forms that have resulted in what she perceives as landscapes in monotypes and etchings. Kathryn specializes in drypoint etchings and monotypes, and this selection of her work shows a richly chromatic series of plant studies.

2) 6:00 PM OUT ON A LIMB (191 E Broadway)

Out on a Limb is a new gallery featuring the wood art of Tim Boyden, Urban Lumber and Drew Parrish. Nature is the big inspiration for their work; almost everything is created from locally salvaged and repurposed materials. Tim Boyden says, "I feel blessed to have so many beautiful trees pass through my hands, aren't trees simply amazing?" The guest artist this month is a fibers and ceramic artist, Mari Livie.

3) 6:30 PM GOLDWORKS JEWELRY ART STUDIO (169 E Broadway)

Goldworks Jewelry Art Studio presents "Accidental Landscapes: Abstracting Place and Process," mixed media work by Claudia Sims. Wine Tastings provided by Sineann Winery. Goldworks is a custom jewelry design studio that has been a part of the greater Northwest art and craft community since 1975.

4) 7:00 PM OLIVE GRAND (1041 Willamette St)

Olive Grand features seven artists in the show "The Many Shades of Red/Passion, Love, Romance." Anne McRae specializes in travel photography. Karen Russo shows paintings and tile work. Rachel McLain displays her photography, through which she aims to highlight tiny details and small beauties that the average passerby would miss. Micaela Russo also shows photography, stating that "This series of photographs shares my fascination with people and place." Janan Dean shows her work with knitting and felting wool. Cecile Haworth presses lace into moist clay to obtain her designs for jewelry, ornaments and wall hangings. Tricia Clark-McDowell is a local watercolor artist and photographer whose work is inspired by living on the 22 acre Cortesia Sanctuary. Music will be provided by "Red Wing Band" of Eugene.

5) 7:30 PM NEST (1235 Willamette)

NEST features the wonderful jewelry of Alice McDonald. Alice specializes in creating unique wire necklaces designed and embellished with exquisite pearls, stones, and glass seed beads. Alice's motto, "Adornments for the Shining Ones," sums up Alice's passion for making the world a more beautiful, peaceful, and shining place, one work of art at a time. Alice sells her work at NEST, as well as at fine art shows and festivals around the Pacific Northwest.
